After a very difficult two years for all of us, two of the school's supporters have made their first trip back to Sierra Leone since October 2019. **Catherine Thomas** and **Michael Houlden** spent two weeks there last month, assessing how best to get there, how the school was doing, and the work that needs to be done.

They tried out a new route, flying via Brussels, completing all the required testing successfully, and organising accommodation and transport to the school. Overall, the venture was very successful, and they intend to return with others in October.

The school is running very well, and there are now over 400 pupils. Luckily, there have been no cases of Covid 19, but a regular hand washing routine is now firmly established.

Catherine and Michael were kept busy during their stay. As well as having lots of contact with the staff and pupils, they sorted shipments in the container some of which were two years old. They distributed uniforms, shoes, clothing, organised teaching materials and gave out classroom supplies.
